Ms. Du Moulin's Class takes a Hike

On Tuesday afternoon, the day before the lunar eclipse, many of the students in Ms. Du Moulin's fifth grade class were able to take an excursion on the city of Prineville's newly developed access area to the top of Barnes Butte. The students were taking a practice hike in preparation for the hike in the dark in the early morning hours during the lunar eclipse on the 31st of January. After writing a persuasive essay to Mr. Bates about the importance of this hike, they were permitted to take a part of the day to explore the trail, learn a little history about the area and take in some of the geological features of the region. For several students and chaperones, this was the first time they had accessed the trail and were able to see the amazing view from above.
